PARTNER HOMEOWNER HIGHLIGHTS

The first PARTNER HOMEOWNER TO PAY OFF HER MORTGAGE

TOSHIA WILLIAMS

HFH GLA has reached a major milestone - as of July 2012, Toshia Williams is our first HFH GLA partner homeowner to pay off her own mortgage. In 1992, Toshia applied for a Habitat home



after her supervisor at work told her that they would be building in Compton, near her workplace. Born and raised in Compton, Toshia jumped at the opportunity to become a homeowner and raise

her own family in a city she called home. Living in substandard conditions with two young children, Toshia dreamed of giving her family a safe and stable environment to thrive. Once approved for a home, Toshia realized the \$490 mortgage payment was less than her current rent so she was able to stay on track and pay off her 20 year mortgage a few months early. Toshia's father, grandmother, cousins, aunts and uncles quickly embraced this opportunity and became a part of the Habitat family, contributing towards her 500 hours of sweat equity. In addition, three other family members have since become Habitat partner homeowners in Compton and Lynwood with HFH GLA.

Toshia's oldest daughter Theresa, 26, was 6 when the family moved into their Habitat home and is currently a student at Cal State Long Beach, studying English and getting her teaching credentials. At their home dedication 21 years ago, Theresa remembers receiving a dictionary from a Habitat staff member and reading it cover to cover, eventually developing a love for books. Theresa has exciting news herself this year, she recently got engaged to her high school sweetheart. Toshia's 24 year old son Johnny, was only 4 when the family moved into their home and is now a security guard with FedEx at LAX and father to 2 year old Ja'neia. Toshia's 14 year old daughter, Tracy is in the 10th grade at a Catholic high school and has enjoyed living in their Habitat home her entire life.

Toshia says, "Owning a home has been such a blessing. I am so grateful and thankful to my parents and my former boss, Mr. Sanders for encouraging me to apply for a Habitat for Humanity house." She adds, "Always set a goal and try to achieve it no matter what, if you get side tracked, find a way to get back on track."





Meet Amanda Jordan and her three children - 11-year-old Frederick and daughters Fa'Ness, 7, and Faith, 2. On Easter Sunday this past spring, the family of four moved into a home in the city of Lynwood. Amanda recently shared how becoming a homeowner has changed her life.

"The Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP2) has been such a blessing. My kids are much happier than before. And my neighbors were excited to meet me as a homeowner. Before our house was renovated, it sat abandoned with squatters living in it. Habitat came along with this wonderful program to help low-income families such as mine afford a home and make over a neighborhood. I thank God every chance I get for such a wonderful blessing and for meeting such wonderful people."

In addition to the excitement of becoming a partner homeowner, Amanda recently entered her daughters in the Yo Gabba Gabba! Children's Bedroom Makeover Contest. Yo Gabba Gabba! teamed up with HFH GLA and D-I-Y designer Holly Westhoff in an unprecedented collaboration to create the ultimate bedroom. After winning the contest, sponsored by Wildbrain Entertainment, with an essay on their "bedtime ritual", Fa'Ness and Faith received a one of kind, dream-come-true bedroom makeover – Yo Gabba Gabba style! South Kozea YOUTH UNITED TEAM



Story written by HFH GLA Youth United Chapter President, Jenny Sim On June 11th-15th, nine Webb students, (Zoey Choi, Jeainny Kim, Thomas Kim, Taco Lee, Sam Nam, Chaewon Park, SangUk Park, Jenny Sim, and SuYeong Yang) participated in Habitat for Humanity's A Brush with Kindness project in Beobwon-eup, Gyeonggi-do, South Korea with the Paju-si affiliate. For quick background info, Beobwon-eup is a city north of Seoul with a lot of Korean and U.S. military bases for protection. The Paju-si affiliate covers most of the cities in Gyeonggi-do, and the city of Paju is located south of 38th Parallel and right next to the DMZ. Most Webb students had to commute nearly 2 hours each day on public transportation to get to the work site. This year we were planning on building a series of houses but the primary land donor bailed out last minute. Again, the Seoul affiliate (like last year) had more support and projects, but we thought it would be meaningless if we built a house in such a big city.

In addition to the nine Webb students, three international students and one post-graduate from Korea joined us. Our job was to renovate an entire house. Throughout the week, we dug 70 cm ditches, renovated the study/guestroom, rebuilt a port-a-potty like restroom (no toilet!!!), wallpapered the bedrooms and reinstalled the kitchen ceiling. We worked from 9 AM to 6 PM every day! Everyone got to use all the tools, from hammers and nails to using power tools like nail guns, electric saws and drills. Most people were new to Habitat, but they were AWESOME! Jeainny was the goddess of nail guns, Sam the god of wall papering and Sang was really really good at digging.

Throughout the week, Sam and Jamie (IIS) worked on the study/ guestroom renovation while Sang, Zoey, SuYeon, Thomas, Eunice Lee (KIS), Joseph (IIS) and Chaewon dug the ditch and connected the water purifier. Taco, Yoonji (post-graduate), Jeainny and I tore down the restroom and rebuilt it from scratch. When the ditch and restroom teams finished (day 3), Sam, Jamie, Sang, Chaewon, Eunice and I worked on dry walling the study/guestroom and wallpaper while the rest of the group worked on the kitchen and bedrooms. On June 14th, Seoul University Law School Habitat club joined us and helped us wallpaper the bedrooms.

Overall, the projects were all relatively difficult, especially for students who were new to Habitat. However, we were able to finish all the work that was assigned to us. Since we have been extremely active with the Habitat Korea, the HFH Korea Headquarters gave all Webb students a gift basket with a letter of appreciation, volunteer authentication, Habitat blanket, mug and notebooks. As always, this project would not have been possible if it wasn't for Webb and its support for Habitat for Humanity.

FOUNDATION Building Affordable Healthy Homes

On Thursday, September 6, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Los Angeles and The Home Depot Foundation joined forces to assist 10 qualified veteran and military families in need of home repairs during The Home Depot Foundation's Celebration of Service. The campaign for service brought together volunteers who worked on 100 veterans' homes nationally, including 10 in the greater Los Angeles area.

Navy veteran Juan Singleton and his family were one of the HFH GLA partner homeowners. The Singletons received new windows, new fencing, exterior painting and a security door. "It's overwhelming - in a good way," Juan Singleton said. "We're very appreciative of them just for choosing us." Joe McFarland, the President of the Western Division of The Home Depot, was on hand with about 40 volunteers in orange T-shirts. In 2011, The Home Depot Foundation committed \$30 million over three years to nonprofit organizations dedicated to improving the homes of economically disadvantaged veterans — a pledge that was surpassed nearly a year ahead of schedule. This year, the Foundation is committing an additional \$50 million over the next three years in an effort to ensure every veteran has a safe place to call home.
