NATIONAL WOMEN BUILD WEEK



More than 10,000 women volunteered to build with Habitat for Humanity throughout the country as part of this year's National Women Build Week (NWBW). NWBW is an annual event sponsored by Lowe's that challenges women to spend a day helping build affordable housing in their local communities. All of the homes were rehabilitated in partnership with the City of Lynwood, partner homeowners and volunteers as part of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Neighborhood Stabilization Program2 (NSP2). Through this program, HFH GLA is rehabilitating foreclosed and abandoned homes in order to provide affordable homeownership opportunities while also improving neighborhoods that we have invested in.

HFH GLA's Youth Programs has partnered with LA's BEST to teach elementary school students how affordable housing can help build stronger communities!

LA's Best stands for Los Angeles' Better Educated Students of

Tomorrow and was founded in 1988 by the L.A. Mayor Tom Bradley in response to the lack of supervision of children during the time period of 3-6pm. LA's BEST now serves 28,000 kids at 189 elementary schools that have low student test scores and are located in neighborhoods vulnerable to gangs, drugs and crime.

LA's BEST and HFH GLA's partnership began in March 2013 with the goal of increasing the youth community's awareness of the opportunities ahead of them in regards to HFH GLA, community service and homeownership. To date, HFH GLA has been to three LA's BEST sites and is looking forward to visiting many more throughout the 2013-2014 school year!

During these site visits students are engaged through HFH GLA fact-based guessing games and photos of children from various places where Habitat builds. These activities then lead to a discussion on the meaning and importance of home. The students always love to learn about other kids and it's amazing to see how much the students know about the world around them. HFH GLA is looking forward to encountering many more great, knowledgeable minds during future LA's BEST adventures!

THE SPEAKERS BUREAU

The Speakers Bureau was formed to respond to requests for more information about Habitat for Humanity's mission and goals and to build awareness about the need for affordable housing. The Speakers Bureau is comprised of a broad group of individuals dedicated to delivering informative presentations to businesses and organizations throughout the Greater Los Angeles area.

Recently the Speakers Bureau had an opportunity to present to the 108th and Hoover Neighborhood Association in Los Angeles. Janice Chang represented HFH GLA at the meeting and provided residents of the community with information about our organization and our programs. Janice is a public policy and budget analyst with the City of Los Angeles and has a passion for public and community service. She began her involvement with Habitat for Humanity ten years ago as a student at UC Berkeley. Today, as a member of our Speakers Bureau, Janice uses her voice, instead of a hammer to help build hope, lives and communities.

HOME REPAIR — PROGRAM —

HFH GLA's A Brush with Kindness and Critical Home Repair programs have recently been combined to fall under the overarching Home Repair Program (HRP). Through the HRP, HFH GLA is providing repairs and non-cosmetic improvements for low-income homeowners to alleviate health and safety issues in and around their home. Repairs are provided free of cost or with a deferred payment, depending on the scope and estimated costs of needed repairs.

As a disabled veteran homeowner, Mr. Sylvester Brooks had difficulty keeping up his home both financially and physically making him a perfect candidate for HRP. HFH GLA partnered with Mr. Brooks to provide kitchen and bathroom plumbing repairs and rebuild his wooden picket fence.

Mr. Brooks has lived in his Compton, California home for more than 57 years. He is retired after working as a manufacturing engineering planner for Rockwell International for 38 years. Before Rockwell, Mr. Brooks served in the United States Air Force. He spent the majority of his time in active enlistment and three years as an active reserve in the medic's dental department. By his third honorable discharge, Mr. Brooks had earned the rank of Staff Sergeant and held a WWII Victory Medal amongst his honors.

In the coming months, HFH GLA's goal is to partner with 25 more veteran households like Mr. Brooks', as well as 25 non-veteran households. Applying is easy! If you meet the eligibility requirements below, you can download an application at www.habitatla.org or call 310-323-4663.





Eligibility Requirements

- Must own a home within the HFH GLA service area.
- Household income must fall under specific guidelines.
- Home must be owner occupied and serve as primary residence of applicant(s).
- Home must be a single family residence, condominium/ townhome or mobile home. Multi-family residences (apartments, duplexes, etc.) are not eligible.
- Be willing to partner with HFH GLA by investing a minimum of 24 sweat equity hours.
- Homeowners must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Legal Resident.
- Veterans must provide proof of service discharge.
