Erin Rank is the President & CEO Habitat for Humanity of Greater Los Angeles (Habitat LA). Over the last 23 years, Erin has helped transform the affordable housing landscape in Los Angeles through sustaining development and construction projects during challenging real estate markets, including the construction of new housing and preserving existing housing stock through repairs and rehabilitations. Through her vision and leadership, Habitat LA is the only non-profit to be named in the Top 25 Residential Developers in LA four years in a row, and one of the top Habitat affiliates nationwide. In the past 10 years, she has overseen the development of \$50 million in real estate with another \$60 million under development.

As a well-respected female CEO, she has helped to create opportunities for women empowerment, in a variety of ways, including helping single mothers qualify to buy their first home and build long-term financial stability. Erin has also served in broader leadership positions including being a Board member of Housing California, Vice Chair of Habitat International's U.S. Council and as a member of Pepperdine University's Social Entrepreneurship and Change Advisory Board.

Kathleen Buckley Domingo serves as Senior Director of the Office of Life, Justice and Peace and Director of Government Relations for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. She leads the efforts to educate and advocate on social issues including abortion, immigration, homelessness and poverty, adoption and foster care, elderly and end of life services, human trafficking, and care for creation. She also directs OneLife LA, a large-scale annual event held in downtown Los Angeles celebrating the beauty and dignity of every human life. Beginning July 1, 2021, she will serve as the new executive director of the California Catholic Conference, the first woman executive director in the history of the Conference.

Kathleen is a national speaker, writer, and organizer, connecting Catholic social doctrine to contemporary social issues and public life. Kathleen serves as Chair of the Board of Human Life Action and participates in Los Angeles city and county task forces for human trafficking, homeless outreach, elder care-giving, and foster care. Kathleen is a Commissioner with the LA County Human Relations Commission and a member of the California Complete Count Committee for Census 2020.

Councilmember Mary Zendejas was elected into office on Tuesday November 5, 2019 and sworn into office on December 3, 2019. She is the first Latina wheelchair user to be elected to office in the nation. She has never met a challenge she couldn't tackle and overcome. As an infant, she was diagnosed with Polio, and later in High School started using a wheelchair daily.

Her passion for living and working hard is rooted in seeing her parents, a field hand and factory worker, provide their children a better life. Their hard-work allowed Mary to go to California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) and become the first in her family to graduate from college.

Her advocacy dates back nearly three decades starting in high school, where she organized citizenship fairs to help community members follow their American Dream of becoming US citizens.


Mary's advocacy work within Washington Neighborhood has been instrumental in developing that community, and she has played an active part in its revitalization.




